

The installations took place at CIPLA's annual meeting on June 14, 2017. Ehrlich has been an active CIPLA member for 10 years, previously serving as vice president and president-elect from 2016 to 2017, as secretary from 2015 to 2016, and treasurer from 2014 to 2015. Partners Michael J. Rye and Daniel F. Drexler are past presidents of CIPLA.

Ehrlich is a patent attorney with a diverse practice in intellectual property (IP), working with large foreign technology companies, startups, and domestic energy-related innovators. He received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Grinnell College, his master's in inorganic chemistry and his doctorate in chemistry from Cornell University, and his J.D. from the University of Connecticut School of Law, with honors.
